BUILDING A FUTURE OF STABILITY

LTHC'S 2024 IMPACT ON HOMELESSNESS

Since 1989, LTHC Homeless Services has been a cornerstone in the Lafayette community, offering vital support to individuals and families experiencing homelessness. Over the past year, the organization has seen a significant increase in demand, with a 20% rise in people seeking assistance, including senior citizens, veterans, and children. Despite growing challenges, LTHC remains committed to its mission of providing stable housing and comprehensive services, guided by the belief that everyone deserves the dignity of a safe home.

In fiscal year 2024, LTHC served a total of 1,874 individuals through its various programs, including 1,503 adults and 371 children, representing 221 families. The Family Permanent Supportive Housing Program provided stable housing and services to 16 adults and 30 children in 11 housing units. At the organization's permanent supportive housing sites—Eighth Street Commons, Lincoln Center, and Union Place—LTHC provided long-term housing to 117 individuals, 98% of whom had disabling conditions.

The **Homeless Services Program (HSP)** remained a vital resource for those in crisis,

completing 1,153 assessments to help individuals find the housing solutions best suited to their needs. Additionally, the Engagement Center offered essential services, such as phone and mail access, showers, laundry, and meals, to 865 individuals, delivering more than 69,000 meals over the course of the year. The Shelter provided 8,056 bed nights for 446 individuals, while Medical Respite offered 644 bed nights to 19 guests recovering from illness or injury.

LTHC's Rapid Re-Housing Program played a pivotal role in helping families and individuals achieve housing stability. In 2024, the program housed 57 families and 92 individuals, including 120 children. In October 2023, we expanded ou RRH service delivery area to Benton, Carroll, Clinton, Fountain, Montgomery, Warren, and White counties, providing housing and services to 171 people, including 34 families with 70 children and 46 individuals.

The organization's **Veteran Services Program** continued to support Veterans and their families, providing housing and case management to **49 Veterans and their families, including 18 children**.

As LTHC continues to address the growing needs of the community, the organization faces significant obstacles, including limited funding and a lack of state support. Indiana currently offers no state funding to directly assist those experiencing homelessness, and LTHC must rely on a combination of grants, donations, and community partnerships to sustain its programs. However, despite these limitations, the organization remains steadfast in its commitment to helping the most vulnerable members of the community.

Through our Engagement Center, we provide Coordinated Assessment for anyone in a housing crisis in Tippecanoe County. Through assessment and triage, we direct people to a housing solution aligned with their needs. We provide Housing Stability Coordinators who create Housing Stability Plans for each client. We offer 24/7, on-site supportive services including phone and mail connectivity, hygiene facilities, meals, transportation assistance, medical respite and safe shelter.


