


Recovery Funds in Response to Health & Economic Crisis \$36 Million in Food Security Infrastructure Grants and Need for Bridge Loans to Access the Funds

The state recently announced a \$36 million grant program to support food security infrastructure in the Commonwealth to respond to the health crisis.

The program is reimbursement-based, so awardees will need to pay in advance for their project before receiving funds. Some grantees could qualify for a bridge loan from the **Massachusetts Food Trust Program (MFTP)**, so that they can access funding to complete their infrastructure project before receiving reimbursement through the Food Security Infrastructure Grant Program.
