

Board of County Commissioners Manatee County, Florida

- WHEREAS, Usher Syndrome is a relatively rare genetic disorder caused by a mutation in 1 of at least 11 genes resulting in a combination of hearing loss and visual impairment and is a leading cause of combined deafness and blindness, it is estimated that more than 400,000 people; and
- WHEREAS, are affected by this genetic disorder worldwide, with many as 25,000 of those in the United States, with 1,028 of those in Florida, vision loss in Usher Syndrome is caused by a progressive vision disorder known as retinitis pigmentosa (RP); and
- WHEREAS, light-sensing cells in the retina gradually deteriorate, initially resulting in night blindness, followed by a narrowing of the visual field, children with Usher Syndrome are born with or develop hearing loss and it is estimated that as many as 10% of people; and
- WHEREAS, with congenital bilateral sensorineural hearing loss have Usher Syndrome, there are three types, Type 1, Type 2 and Type 3, which are distinguished by the severity and age when the signs and symptoms appear, because of the limited public awareness those affected; and
- WHEREAS, with Usher Syndrome many suffer from depression, anxiety, isolation, and loss of independence, the Usher Syndrome community is uniting around the world to spread public awareness but is especially recognized the 3rd Saturday of September annually;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, that Saturday, September 20, 2025, shall be known, designated, and set aside as

USHER SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY

in Manatee County, Florida.
