

WHEREAS: Usher Syndrome is a relatively rare genetic disorder caused by a mutation

in any one of at least 11 genes resulting in a combination of hearing loss and visual impairment, and is a leading cause of combined deafness

and blindness; and

**WHEREAS**: More than 400,000 people are affected by this genetic disorder worldwide,

with at least 2,400 of those in Canada; and

WHEREAS: Usher syndrome, which is incurable presently, impacts three major senses

in the body: Vision, Hearing, and Balance

WHEREAS: There are three clinical types: Type 1, Type 2 and Type 3, which are

distinguished by the severity and age when the signs and symptoms appear. There are at least eleven different genetic types of Usher syndrome. One cannot determine the genetic type by clinical testing, as DNA testing is the

only reliable way of determining the true genetic type; and

**WHEREAS:** Because of limited public awareness, those affected with Usher syndrome

may suffer from depression, anxiety, isolation, and loss of independence. The Usher syndrome community is uniting around the world to spread public awareness but especially to be recognized annually, the

3rd Saturday of September.
